Flash floods in the Leh district of Jammu and Kashmir has affected approximately 10,000 men, women and children. More than 185 people lost their lives and nearly 700 are missing. The old town of Leh has been the worst affected.

Flood victims are struggling to get access to food, water and shelter. Children and women have been the worst affected.

With winter fast approaching and temperature likely to dip to freezing degrees, the issue of shelter is emerging as a single most priority for the affected population.

The present situation

- ◆ At least **10,000** men, women and children affected
- ◆ More than **185** lives lost and more than **700** missing
- ◆ Thousands are homeless
- ◆ Many have no access to safe drinking water and proper sanitation.



Oxfam India reaching out to:

- ◆ **9** villages in and around Leh town
- ◆ **2000** households in the affected areas get access to safe drinking water, and proper sanitation
- ◆ **2000** families with winterized shelters gearing them up for freezing winters
- ◆ Clean-up of debris filled villages to bring normalcy
- ◆ Provide household support for **2000** affected families.

What we need?

An estimated 2.7 crores is required to reach out to the needy and people in despair and provide them with safe drinking water, household support, shelter and hygiene sanitation.
